

Ligature points: environment checklist

A prompt for walk-rounds, team discussions and training

Use alongside your organisation's ligature risk assessment policy and recording tools. A ligature point (anchor point) is anything a ligature could be attached to.

The environment

- ☐ Every area people can access has been walked round, including bedrooms, bathrooms, communal areas and outside spaces.
- ☐ Fixtures, fittings and furniture have been checked for ligature points, including low-level ones.
- ☐ Changes from wear and tear, damage, repairs or new items have been looked for.
- ☐ Findings, controls and actions are recorded, for example with an annotated layout or photos.

People and practice

- ☐ Each person's risk is assessed individually and recorded in their care or support plan.
- ☐ Staff know each person's plan and how it applies to the rooms and areas they use.
- ☐ Engagement is supportive and therapeutic, not observation alone.
- ☐ People who use the service, families and staff are involved in decisions where possible.

Staff and response

- ☐ All staff, including agency and new staff, know the environment and the controls in place.
- ☐ Staff know the emergency procedure, when to call 999 and where emergency equipment is kept.
- ☐ Incidents are reported and reviewed, and staff are supported afterwards.
- ☐ The assessment is reviewed after any incident, change or concern, and on the date your policy sets.
